Interview Dates: June 6-8, 2020
Sample Population: 2119 registered voters in the United States.
Sample Selection: Scientific online poll - stratified sample of panel respondents.
Weighting Parameters: The sample was weighted based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Voting and Registration Supplement to the Current Population Survey for registered voters in the United States based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, household income, census region, and Hispanic ethnicity.

These cross tabulations provide weighted percentages, as well as the unweighted $N$-sizes for the total sample and subsamples. Due to the effects of weighting and rounding, figures may or may not add up to $100 \%$. The standard deviation of the weights was: 0.2090701 . The maximum weight was: 1.6694817 . The minimum weight was: $0.3466401 .95 \%$ of the weights were between $0.4113331,1.3173855$.

Margin of Error: The $95 \%$ credibility interval for this survey is $+/-2.1 \%$, which includes the square root of the design effect (DEFT): 1.0216113 .
